Preparation for Enteroscopy: MIRALAX

<u>FIVE DAYS PRIOR to your procedure:</u> If you are on Coumadin or Plavix you need to stop taking the medication. Otherwise continue to take all other medications as usual including the day of the procedure as long as it is 4 hours before arriving to the facility.

<u>Three days prior to your procedure:</u> Stop Iron and Fiber supplements (Wheat bread, oat meal, bran, fruit, vegetables, nuts). You may have proteins, dairies and starches. After you're procedure you may return to your normal diet.

Two Days prior to the procedure: After lunch, begin a clear liquid diet. You'll continue this diet till 4 hours prior to your procedure time. Coffee is not a clear liquid. NO RED, ORANGE & PURPLE COLORS. IF YOU ARE A DIABETIC DO NOT DRINK ANY DIET LIQUIDS IT MAY CAUSE YOUR SUGAR TO DROP.

<u>What is needed</u>: (found over the counter at any pharmacy):
Ducolax tablets (you need 4 pills) and a 119-gram bottle Miralax you will need both. Also needed is 32ozs of a clear liquid such as Gatorade or Crystal Lite. <u>You cannot have RED, PURPLE or ORANGE colors.</u>

One Day prior to the procedure: You may start your preparation as early as you would like to but you need to make sure you start it no later than 4pm. First take 2 Ducolax tablets. One hour later mix the entire bottle of Miralax with 32oz of clear liquid, shake until Miralax is dissolved. Slowly drink an 8oz glass of Miralax about every 15-20 minutes until 32oz are consumed. Wait 1 hour then take the last 2 Ducolax tablets.

Important Notes: You CANNOT drive after the procedure. A friend or relative can stay with you or pick you up. You will be at the facility about 2-3 hours in total. If a biopsy was taken please call our office 10 days after your procedure for results.
